

Chairman of board evict bid



The former longtime president of the National Arts Club and his twin brother say they're being targeted for eviction because they have a disease: hoarding.

The board of the tony Gramercy Park institution is trying to boot Aldon and John James for hogging apartments for their belongings, but in papers filed in Manhattan Supreme Court, the pair say they can't help it.

It's been "known by the board of governors for many years that plaintiffs . . . have suffered from a compulsive hoarding disorder," their suit says.

The club says there's no reason the twins and their pal, Steven Leitner, should have seven apartments to themselves.

The board was originally slated to vote on their ouster last night, but the trio got a temporary reprieve: On Sept. 15, Justice Carol Edmead will hold a hearing on their allegations that the board isn't following proper procedure.
